

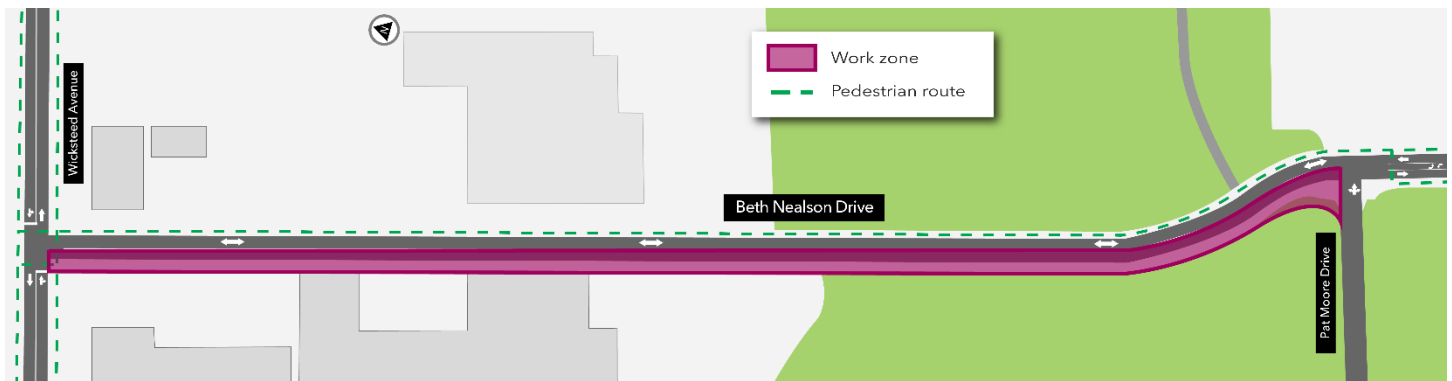
Utility relocations along Beth Neilson Drive

Expected duration: October 6, 2025, to November 30, 2025

Hours of work: Weekdays between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. and Saturdays between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

What is happening?

- To support the construction of the future Ontario Line subway, Enbridge Gas will be relocating a portion of its existing utilities along Beth Neilson Drive, from Wicksteed Avenue to Pat Moore Drive.
- This work is anticipated to begin on Monday, October 6, 2025, with a projected completion date of November 30, 2025. This timing is approximate and may be impacted by inclement weather or other factors.
- Work will be conducted by NPL Canada on behalf of Enbridge Gas.
- This utility relocation work enables the construction of the new underpass, which will support a new rail bridge and tracks to carry the future Ontario Line subway.



What to expect

- Road users, including TTC transit riders, may experience delays travelling near the work zone.
- Properties located near the work site may hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, tri-axes, backhoes and other construction equipment.
- Paid duty officers and/or traffic control personnel will be on-site as needed to ensure pedestrian safety and assist with traffic flow.
- Access to residences will always be maintained.
- Construction equipment and materials will be secured within work zones to ensure safety.
- All necessary permits have been obtained for this work.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen weather conditions or other construction-related circumstances.

About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 transit connections, including GO, TTC, and more.
- Approximately 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
