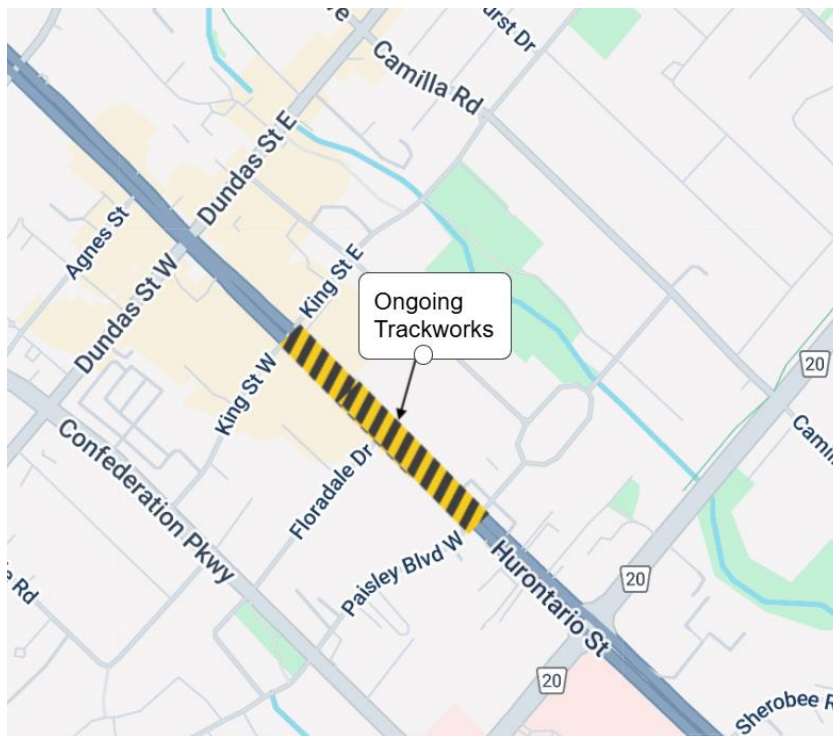


Lane Restrictions for Guideway Work from King Street to Paisley Boulevard October 2025 to March 2026



What work is taking place?

Daily lane restrictions of either the inner northbound or southbound lanes along Hurontario Street will take place through December for guideway, track and stop construction work. Lane restrictions will only occur 500 metres at a time. A "2+1 lane configuration" will be in place and left-turn lanes will be maintained at signalized intersections.

This work will include guideway construction, track installation and welding, concrete pouring (including stops), track demolition as needed, track distressing, and asphalt infills. Work will take place seven days a week until late March, from 7a.m. to 7p.m., Monday to Saturday.

TIMING

- Work will take place seven days a week until late December 2025, from 7am to 7pm, Monday to Sunday.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Traffic lanes will be impacted. Please follow the traffic signage along the roadway.
- Motorists can expect daily closures of either the inner northbound or southbound lanes along Hurontario Street.
