Overnight work on McCowan Road south of Brimorton Drive

Start date/Duration: Tuesday, October 14 through Friday, October 17, 2025

Hours of work: Overnight 7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.

Note: Dates may be impacted due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.





What is happening?

- To enable Scarborough Subway Extension construction activities, a geotechnical instrumentation monitoring program will begin in the vicinity of the jet grouting site on McCowan Road south of Brimorton Road, as shown on the map.
- The program involves placing structural monitoring tools (instruments) within and close to our work sites and the future tunnels to help monitor ground conditions.
- Crews will work overnight starting on Tuesday October 14, 2025 to install the necessary equipment at several locations in the area.

Vehicle diversions

- Traffic will be diverted to the west side of McCowan Road to a single lane, with flaggers alternating traffic.
- Diversions will be indicated with signage and barriers.

What to expect?

- Each work zone will be temporarily blocked off for safety until installation is complete.
- Installation at each location is typically completed within one day, and involves:
 - o Drilling a small hole through the concrete or asphalt.
 - o Vacuuming soil from the hole using a hydrovac truck, to a depth of about 1.5 metres.
 - o Installation of the monitoring tool. Monitoring tools sit flush with the ground. Gaps will be backfilled and sealed with grout.
 - Note: Some monitoring tools may require a deeper installation and the use of a drill rig. These monitors are installed up to 40 metres deep.
 - Work involves the use of a coring machine, hydrovac truck and a track-mounted drill rig.
- During some phases of work, noise and dust from construction equipment is expected.

About the project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options, including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, Line 5 Eglinton, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
