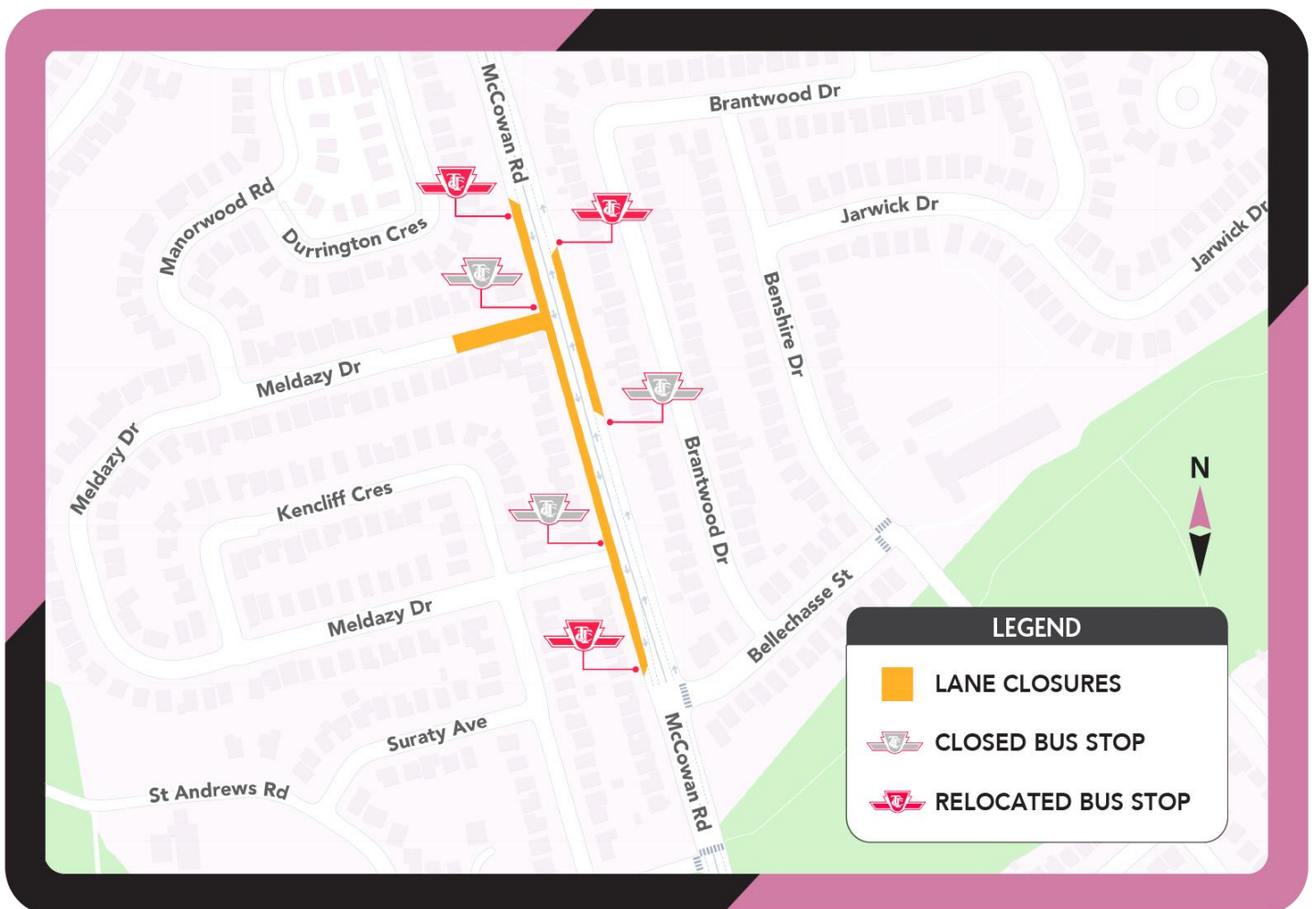


Temporary lane closures on McCowan Road and Meldazy Drive for telecommunication and hydro line relocation

Schedule: Late October 2025 to early January 2026

Hours of Work: 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., weekdays

Note: Dates may be impacted due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.



What is Happening

- As part of Scarborough Subway Extension construction, crews need to relocate telecommunications and hydro lines on the east and west sides of McCowan Road and at the northern intersection of Meldazy Drive and McCowan Road.
- This work will require temporary lane closures.

What to Expect

- Relocation of the telecommunications and hydro lines will be completed in several phases in order to minimize traffic impacts.
- Only one northbound or southbound curb lane will be closed on McCowan Road at any given time.
- One lane will be maintained on Meldazy Drive at all times and lane closures on Meldazy will be removed at the end of each shift.
- Flaggers and/or Paid Duty Officers will be on-site, as needed, to assist with traffic flow.
- When work zones conflict with bus stops, they will be temporarily relocated (approximately 20 - 30 metres to the north or south), ensuring continued access to transit services.
- There will be no telecommunications or hydro interruptions to residents or businesses as a result of this work.
- Sidewalk access will be maintained during the work period.
- Crews will use specialized equipment such as excavators, concrete saw cutters, and a hydro vac truck to remove the asphalt and gravel and dig a trench to relocate telecommunications lines.
- Residents may hear noise from this construction activity. Crews will be monitoring the activity and will take steps to mitigate noise where possible.
- Dust suppression measures will be in place to minimize air quality impacts.
- Work areas will be clearly marked or fenced off to ensure public safety.

About the Project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options, including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, Line 5 Eglinton, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
