
Construction Update

Electrical Infrastructure Upgrades, Track Installation, and Road Widening Between Park Street and South Service Road/HWY QEW



Ongoing and Upcoming Works:

As construction on the Hazel McCallion Line progresses, communities in Mississauga South can expect the following construction activities in the coming months:

- Road widening activities along the east side of Hurontario Street, including the construction of curbs, sidewalks and the multi-use path, and lane closures.
- Removal of old hydro and telecommunication poles along Hurontario Street (east and west side) to help facilitate the permanent restoration of driveways and exiting boulevards.
- Installation of new hydro poles and the pulling of overhead and underground electrical cables, connecting properties to the new hydro infrastructure. Residents will be contacted if temporary power outage is required.



- Civil guideway work and track installation along Hurontario Street at the Indian Valley/Pinewood Trail and Pinetree Way intersections, resulting in temporary road closures and detours.
- Installation of guideway and track works connecting Port Credit Station and Eaglewood along the west side of Hurontario Street.
- Installation of permanent traffic signals at Park Street, Mineola Road, Indian Valley/Pinewood Trail and Pinetree Way intersections, as well as the installation of streetlights along Hurontario Street.

As construction staging moves to the center of the roadway for guideway, track, and LRT stop construction, we remind the motorists that permanent turning restrictions will be implemented to ensure the safe flow of traffic.

Most work is scheduled from Monday to Saturday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and will take place within the staged area separated by traffic barrels and temporary fencing. Temporary closures of roadways at intersections will be required to ensure that crews onsite are able to safely complete the work. Some overnight and weekend work may also be required. Additional notification will be provided when there is a requirement for a temporary road closure, overnight, or Sunday work. We will also communicate with individual property owners concerning potential property access requirements such as temporary power outages, utility connections, and temporary driveway closures for final restoration and boulevard grading. Additional signage will also be placed to inform motorists and pedestrians about any sidewalk closures or changes to traffic configuration.

TIMING

- Regular work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Saturday, with the possibility of work occurring 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- We will provide further notification to residents if work is scheduled overnight and on Sundays.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Traffic lanes will be impacted. Please follow the signs installed along the roadway.
- Motorists are advised to use alternate routes.

- Crosswalks and sidewalks will be impacted for short durations.
- Please take care when walking or cycling near construction areas and watch for additional signs directing the public such as detours and dismounting.
