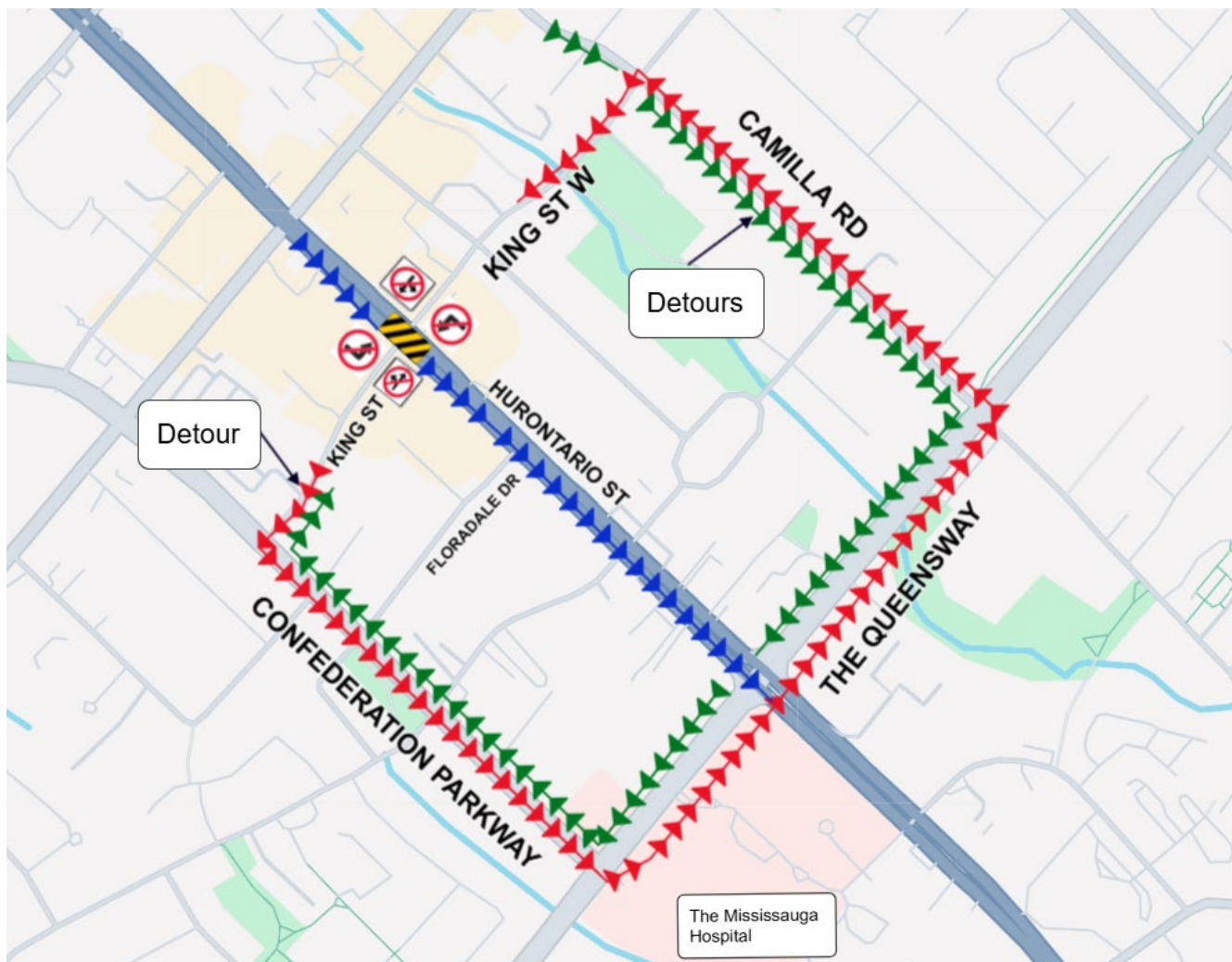


East/West Traffic and Turning Restrictions for Track Installation at King Street and Hurontario Street

Beginning November 17, 2025 at 10 p.m. to December 18 2025, at 10 p.m.



Project Overview

The Hazel McCallion Line project will be an 18-kilometre, 19-stop light rail service connecting people from the Port Credit GO station to the Brampton Gateway Terminal.

What You Need to Know

Crews will be welding tracks and doing concrete work for guideway installation within the intersection of Hurontario Street and King Street. This work is scheduled to begin **November 17, 2025, at 10 p.m., until December 18, 2025, at 10 p.m.** During this work, east-west traffic will be prohibited at King Street, across Hurontario Street in each direction. Left turns will also not be permitted in the intersection. Detours for eastbound traffic along King Street West are available via Confederation Parkway, The Queensway and Camilla Road. Detours for westbound traffic along King Street are available via Camilla Road, The Queensway and Confederation Parkway.

In order to expedite construction, works at this intersection can be scheduled 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Traffic signal timings will be adjusted to keep people moving. Pedestrian crossings will be maintained at a signalized crosswalk. Please follow the signs installed to assist with navigating around the closure.

Transit services will be impacted by these construction works. Please visit www.miway.ca/updates for updates on your bus route, including a detour for Route 4.

In accordance with City of Mississauga Noise By-Law Exemption requirements, this notice is meant to advise that residents near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, triaxles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

Please note, work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. Please see roadway signage for the latest information. If you require the most up-to-date information, please reach out to peel@metrolinx.com and our team will provide you with e-updates of this work.

TIMING

- Intersection work is scheduled to begin November 17, 2025, and continue until December 18, 2025.
- Construction can be scheduled to take place 24/7, Monday through Sunday.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Eastbound and westbound movements will not be permitted in each direction.
- Left turns at King Street and Hurontario Street will not be permitted.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, tri-axles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRANSIT DETAILS

- Visit MiWay.ca for updates on your bus route, including a detour for Route 4.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.

PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas.
- Sidewalk access in the area could be affected.
- Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians as detours may be required.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

PROPERTY DETAILS

- Crews will not require property access for this work.
