

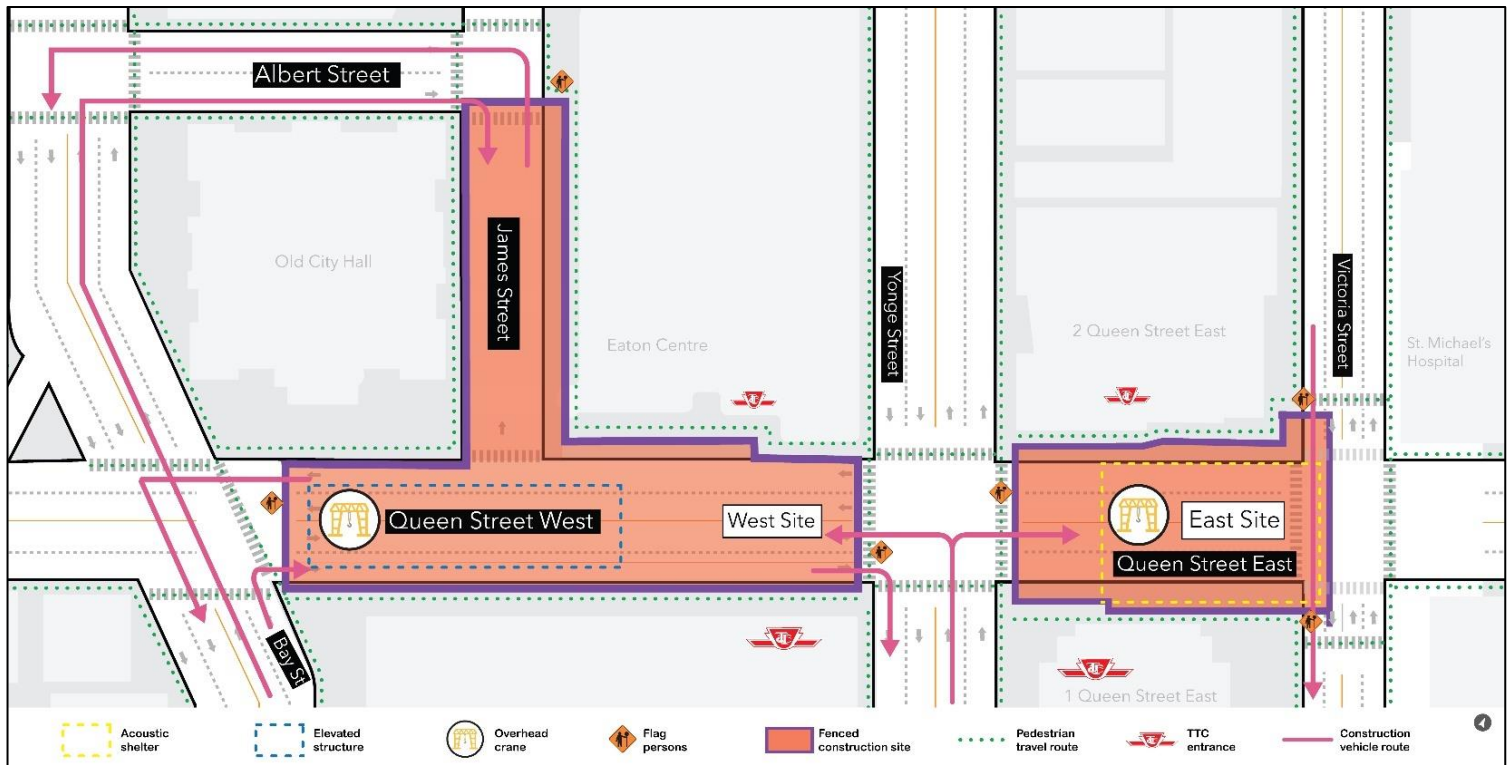
Overnight signage installation at Queen Station

Expected start date and time: As early as November 12, 2025

Expected duration: Up to one (1) week

Hours of work: Weekdays (Monday to Friday) from 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

What is happening?

- New signage panels will be installed on the hoarding around the perimeter fencing of the construction zones at the location of the future Queen station on the Ontario Line. The perimeter is indicated in purple on the map above.
- To maintain safety measures for the public during the installation process, pedestrian access will be detoured around the works. Flag personnel will direct pedestrians as required during installation of the signage along the site perimeter.
- Work will begin as soon as Wednesday, November 12, 2025. The work is expected to be completed in two overnight shifts. Crews may return to the panels to make adjustments up to one week after the initial installation.

What to expect

- Crews will install Ontario Line signage along the walkway at the intersections of Queen Street with James Street, Yonge Street and Victoria Street, on both the north and south sides of the street.
- Flag personnel will direct pedestrians to detour around areas of this work as required.
- Work is expected to take place overnight between 9:00 P.M. - 5:00 A.M. starting as early as Wednesday November 12, 2025. Work is expected to be completed over two overnight shifts.
- Work crews may be on-site prior to 9:00 P.M. to set up equipment.
- Safety barriers will be in place to separate pedestrians from the work zone, where required
- Work crews will take all measures to reduce noise impacts from this work activity.
- Crews will also take measures to minimize impact on road traffic when unloading signage panels.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances, including weather-based delays or re-schedules.
- Work area based on information provided and to be modified in field as required.
