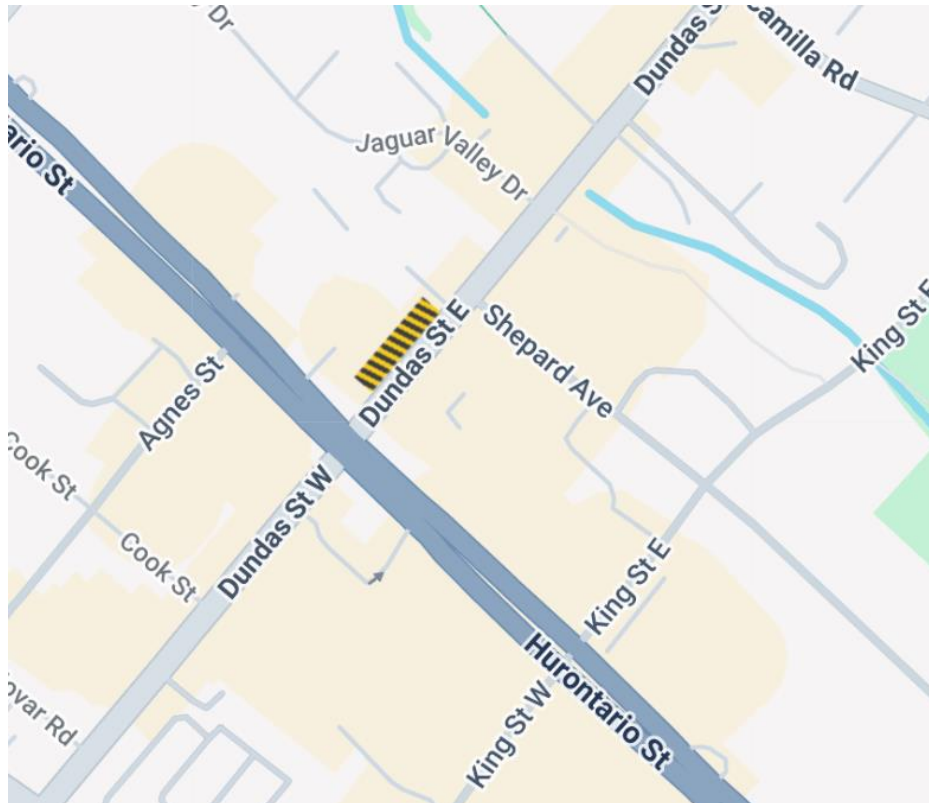


Overnight Traction Power Substation (TPSS) Delivery at Dundas Street East, and Hurontario Street

From 7 p.m. on November 20, 2025, to 7 a.m. on November 21, 2025



What work is taking place?

Traction Power Substations (TPSS) will be placed along the corridor, providing electricity for the light rail vehicles for the Hazel McCallion LRT. TPSS 4 will be delivered to Metrolinx lands, located on the northeast side of Hurontario Street and Dundas Street East.

The delivery is scheduled to take place overnight, from 7 p.m. on November 20, 2025, to 7 a.m. on November 21, 2025. Paid duty police officers (PDOs) and flaggers will be onsite to minimize any traffic impacts and to ensure the safety of the delivery operations. All work is being done on Metrolinx lands within the staged area. Temporary fencing is already in place to mark out the work zone.

This notice is meant to advise that residents near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

Please note, work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. If you require the most up-to-date information, please reach out to peel@metrolinx.com and our team will provide you with e-updates of this work.

TIMING

- TPSS installation delivery is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. on November 20, 2025, with unloading taking place into the overnight hours. Work is expected to be completed by 7 a.m. on November 21, 2025.
- Work could be rescheduled and/or delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRANSIT IMPACT DETAILS

- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Access to properties will be maintained.
- Businesses near work site can expect to hear noise caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- There will be no significant closures to the right of way (ROW) including Hurontario Street and Dundas Road East.
- Paid duty police officers (PDOs) and flaggers will be onsite to minimize any traffic impacts and to ensure the safety of the delivery operations.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching work sites.

PEDESTRIAN DETAILS

- Please take care when walking or cycling near construction areas and watch for additional signs directing the public such as detours and dismounting.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.
