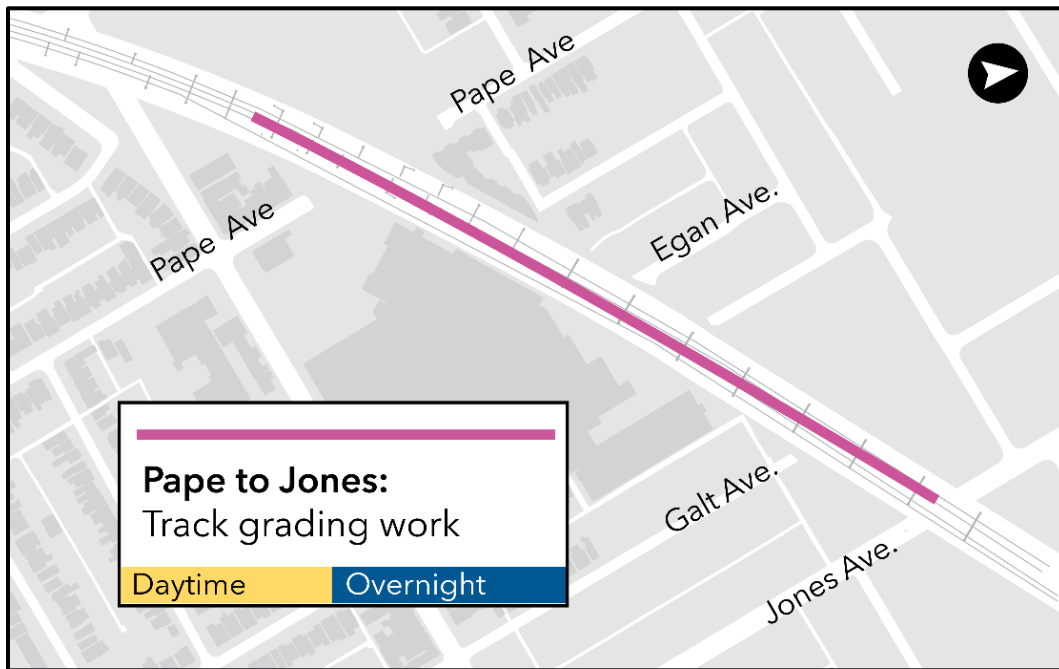


Overnight work in the Lakeshore East rail corridor between Pape Ave and Jones Ave

Date and duration: Starting as early as Wednesday, February 4, 2026, for two weeks.

Hours of work: Work will be 24 hours on weekdays. Less disruptive work will take place overnight.



What is happening?

- Starting as early as Wednesday, February 4, 2026, track grading work will take place for approximately two weeks.
- The construction activities will take place entirely within the work corridor between Pape Ave. and Jones Ave.
- Between 9:00 P.M. and 7:00 A.M., crews will focus on excavation activities. During the day, granular materials will be placed and compacted. Residents in the surrounding area may feel vibrations from the compaction work.
- This work will bring the surface of the rail corridor to the same level. This will facilitate the installation of additional tracks in the future.

What to expect

- Construction activities will include backfilling material and placing stones in the rail corridor.
- Disruptive activities will be scheduled during the daytime wherever possible, and noise mitigations, such as barriers and coverings, will be used to reduce impacts.
- This work will take place between Pape Ave. to Jones Ave. No new traffic or pedestrian impacts are expected.

- Construction vehicles will enter and exit from the existing access roads.
- Site lighting will be required at night and will be positioned away from residential properties.
- Noise and vibration from construction equipment, including excavators, track surfacing equipment, rollers, loaders, dump trucks and hand tools (hammers), can be expected.
- Monitoring instruments are in place to ensure that noise and vibration levels stay within acceptable limits.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zone.
- This work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.
