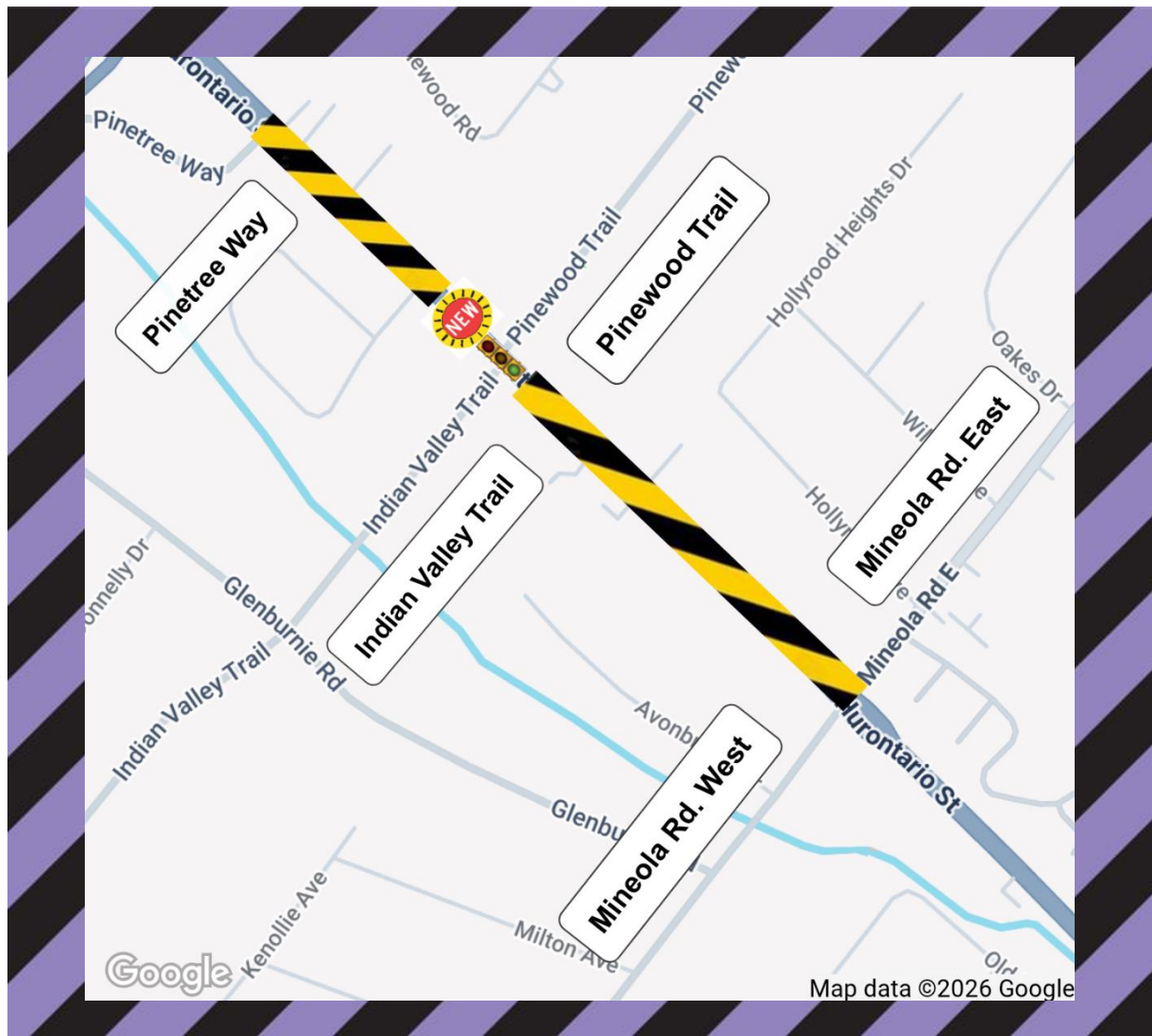


Lane and Turning Restrictions for Guideway Work from Mineola Road to Pinetree Way February 2026 to Summer 2026



What work is taking place?

Lane and turning restrictions will be in place along Hurontario Street from Mineola Road to Pinetree Way to support ongoing guideway, track, and stop construction. As part of this work, a new signalized intersection will be created at Pinewood Trail/Indian Valley Trail and Hurontario Street. Guideway and track work will be conducted only at one intersection at a time, and the local community will be notified of detours in advance of works.

Northbound and southbound traffic will be reduced to a single lane in each direction.

This work includes guideway construction, track installation and welding and asphalt infills. Work is scheduled to take place Monday to Saturday, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., until late Summer 2026.

As guideway infrastructure is installed in the center of the roadway, changes to turning movements become permanent. Left turns and U-turns will only be permitted at signalized intersections, and driveways along this stretch will operate on a right-in, right-out model.

Please note, if Sunday or overnight work is required, nearby residents will be notified in advance in accordance with the City of Mississauga's noise by-law requirement

TIMING

- Work will place from Monday to Saturday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Traffic lanes will be impacted. Please follow the traffic signage along the roadway.
- Motorists can expect daily closures of either the inner northbound or southbound lanes along Hurontario Street.
