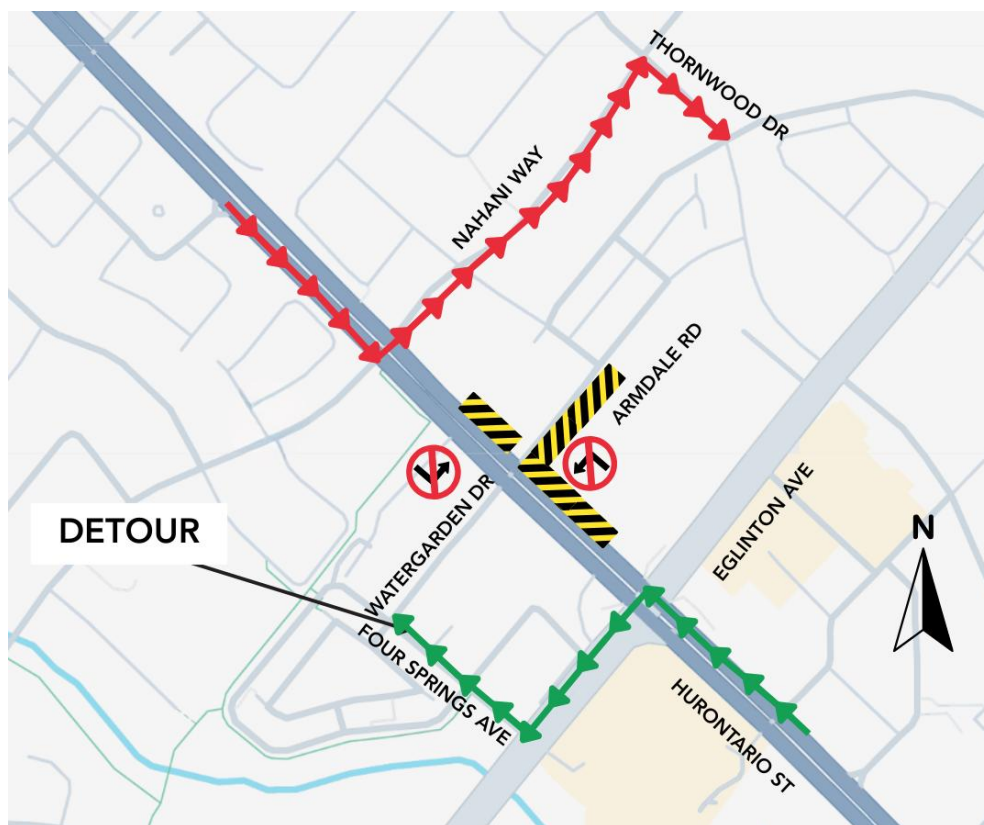


# Traction Power Substation (TPSS) Cable Pulling at Hurontario Street and Armdale Road/Watergarden Drive

February 17 at 10 p.m. to March 31, 2026 at 7 p.m.  
Monday to Saturday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.



## What You Need to Know

Crews will be conducting a cable pulling operation to one of the Traction Power Substations (TPSS). This work is scheduled to begin February 17, 2026, at 10 p.m. and continue until March 31, 2026, at 7p.m. Work will occur daily, Monday to Saturday 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

During this work, left turns will be prohibited from Hurontario Street onto Armdale Road and Watergarden Drive. Access to the back of plaza at 5035 Hurontario will be closed on Armdale Road. Detours are available via Eglinton Avenue, Four Springs Avenue, Nahani Way and Thornwood Drive. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained during this work.

Pedestrian crossings will be impacted during the work, including sidewalk closures along the east side of Hurontario Street and south side of Watergarden Drive and Armdale Road. Please follow the signs installed to assist with navigating around the closure. Transit services and bus stops will not be impacted by these construction works.

Please note, work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. Please see roadway signage for the latest information. #### **TIMING**

- The TPSS cable pulling operation is scheduled to take place Monday to Saturday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. from February 17 to March 31, 2026.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

#### **TRAFFIC DETAILS**

- Northbound and southbound traffic will be prohibited from making left-turns onto Watergarden Drive and Armdale Road.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.
- Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained during this work.

#### **WHAT TO EXPECT?**

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Residents and businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, triaxles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.

#### **TRANSIT DETAILS**

- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.

#### **PEDESTRIAN DETAILS**

- Please take care when travelling near construction areas.
- Sidewalk access along the east side of Hurontario will be affected.
- Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians as detours may be required.
- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

#### **PROPERTY DETAILS**

- Crews will not require private property access for this work.
