


UPDATE: Lane Closures at Highway 401 Overpass at Hurontario Street

February 22, 2026 to May 19, 2026



What You Need to Know

As part of the construction of the Guideway and Highway 401 overpass structure rehabilitation works, strengthening the structure is required. To accomplish this, several K-Frames at the bottom of the bridge are to be replaced at the 401bridge structure. K-frames are a type of bracing system used in bridges and buildings to provide stability against sideways forces like wind. This construction work will take place between February 22, 2026, and May 19, 2026, during the overnight hours only between 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. each day, Monday to Saturday.

Overnight Highway 401 lane reductions in eastbound (EB) and westbound (WB) directions in sequence will take place for a small stretch of Highway 401 as it passes under Hurontario Street, with minimum one lane open in each direction for collectors and express sections. On Hurontario Street, northbound (NB) and southbound (SB) lane reduction will take place in multiple stages during these periods of work every night for vehicular traffic access only.

For Hurontario Street northbound and southbound traffic, no trucks with three axels or more will be allowed to go through Highway 401 overpass structure during overnight construction periods only. Any trucks with three axels or more will be re-routed (see detour notes and map) between 10:00 pm to 5:00 am each night, Monday to Saturday.

Detour routes for trucks requiring access to Hurontario Street will be as follows:

- **Westbound traffic from Highway 401 needing access to southbound Hurontario:**

Exit onto Hurontario Street, travel **north** to **Courtneypark Drive East**, continue **east** to **Kennedy Road**, then head **south** to **Britannia Road**, and travel **west** to reach **Hurontario Street** southbound.

- **Eastbound traffic from Highway 401 needing access to northbound Hurontario:**

Use the **Whittle Road ramp**, then travel **east** along **Britannia Road** to **Kennedy Road**, continue **north** to **Courtneypark Drive**, and travel **west** to reach **Hurontario Street** northbound.

Highway 401 EB and WB lanes will operate as per current standard lane configurations during the hours of 6:00 am to 10:00 pm during this construction period. In addition, there will be no vehicle or truck traffic restrictions on Hurontario Street NB and SB lanes during the hours of 6:00 am to 10:00 pm during this construction period.

Transit services will be impacted by these temporary intersection closures. Please visit www.miway.ca/updates and www.brampton.ca/transit for updates on your bus route. In accordance with City of Mississauga Noise By-Law Exemption requirements, this notice is meant to advise that residents near the work site can expect to hear noise and vibration caused by trucks, excavators, loaders, tri-axles, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work. Please note that work may be rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. TIMING

- Work at Hurontario Street and Highway 401 is scheduled from February 22, 2026, to May 19, 2026.
- Construction work in the area is scheduled to take place six days a week (Monday to Saturday), from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

TRAFFIC DETAILS

- Split configuration of lane closure will take place, with up to three lanes at once closed on each WB and EB side. At minimum one lane will remain open on each collector and express sections, for both WB and WB lanes.
- Restrictions on larger vehicles (three axles or more) travelling on Hurontario overpass, which will use detour routes.
- Traffic delays are expected.
- Watch for slow moving vehicles entering and exiting work areas.
- Remember to reduce your speed when approaching lane reductions.

TRANSIT DETAILS

- Please visit MiWay.ca and gotransit.com for updates on your bus route.
- Watch for additional signs directing passengers at bus stops as boarding areas may be relocated.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

- Every effort will be made to minimize disruptions.
- Access to properties will be maintained.
- Businesses near the work site can expect to hear noise caused by trucks, excavators, backhoes, and other construction equipment related to this work.
