


# **UPDATED: Dundas Street East weekend road closure for bridge reconstruction**

## **Dates and hours of work:**

Friday, February 27, 2026, at 7 p.m. until 5 a.m. on Monday, March 2, 2026



## **What is happening?**

- Overnight work will be taking place at Logan Ave, starting on Friday February 27 at 7:00 P.M. until 5:00 A.M. on Monday, March 2. Dundas St E will be closed for this duration.
- This work was originally scheduled for the previous weekend of February 20-23.
- These road closures are required to install the girders for the new bridge deck.
- Girders are large steel beams that will be installed between the two sides of the bridge to support the weight of the trains travelling above.
- Overnight work will be required to install the bridge girders.
- More disruptive work will be scheduled during the day to minimize overnight noise.

## Traffic and pedestrian details

- No traffic, pedestrian, or cyclist access will be permitted beneath the Dundas St East bridge.
- Access for residents and businesses (local traffic) will be maintained east of Broadview Avenue and west of Logan Avenue.
- Road closure signage will be posted at Broadview Ave and Logan Ave to direct traffic
- Traffic will be diverted both ways via Broadview Ave., Queen St. E., Logan Ave. and Carlaw Ave as indicated in the map.
- Cyclists will be diverted both ways via Boulton Ave., Degrassi St., First Ave., Gerrard St. E., and Logan Ave.
- Advance signage will be in place to notify drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists of the closure.
- Paid Duty Officers will be stationed at each end of the road closure to help vehicles and pedestrians navigating the area.

## What to expect

- The new bridge girders will be lifted into place by a crane.
- Once the girders are in place, crews will install them using hand tools such as drills and welding equipment.
- Noise from construction equipment including cranes, flat bed trucks, and hand tools, can be expected.
- Noise mitigation measures, including temporary noise barriers and noise reducing equipment, will be implemented as required.
- After the girders are installed, and the road closures are completed, crews will pour the concrete that will form the new bridge deck.
- Clear traffic control signage will be in place to direct vehicles and pedestrians.
- Traffic control measures such as barrels, fencing, and barriers will be in place to separate and secure work zones.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zones.
- Work may be delayed due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

## About the project

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, streetcar and bus lines.
- Approximately 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
