

Update: Installation of monitoring devices at Moss Park Station

Expected start date: End of June 2026

Expected end date: August 2026

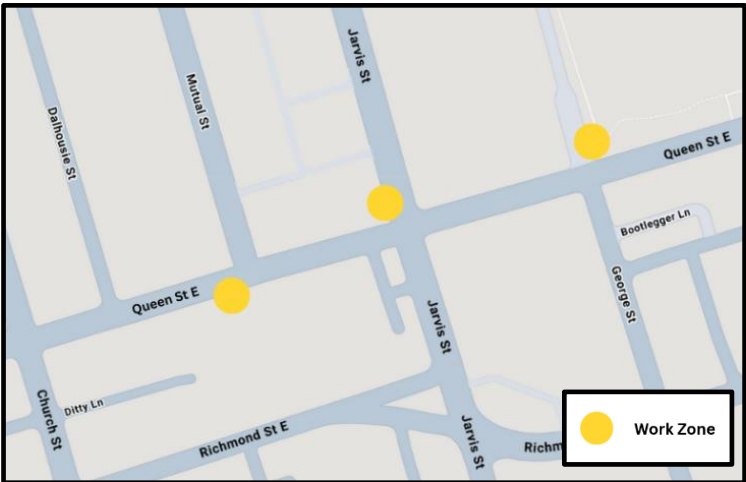
What is happening?

- Crews are installing monitors and investigating underground utilities at the **Moss Park** Ontario Line construction site, as indicated in the area shown in yellow on the map above. This work is required to monitor ground conditions for future Ontario Line tunnelling.
- Monitors will be installed underground and are expected to stay in place until the project's completion, with crews occasionally revisiting for testing and inspection.
- Temporary lane and sidewalk closures are required to carry out this work safely.

What to expect

- The work is scheduled to begin as early as **June 2026** and is expected to be completed **by the end of August 2026**.
- Residents and businesses may hear noise from hydrovac trucks or drills during utility and ground assessments. Crews will minimize noise impacts where possible.
- All work closures are temporary and intermittent, occurring only while crews are working. Once the monitoring device installation is complete, the area will reopen to the public. Flaggers will be present on-site to safely direct traffic around the work zone.

Expected start date: As early as end of June 2026

Expected duration: Up to two months

Hours of work: 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

The following intermittent closures are anticipated:

- The westbound curb lane on Queen Street East near Mutual Street
- The eastbound curb lane on Queen Street East near Mutual Street
- The southbound curb lane on Jarvis Street near Queen Street East
- The northbound lane on George Street near Queen Street East (laneway between Ontario Line Moss Park construction site and the Moss Park Armoury)
- Traffic will be maintained in all directions.
- Signage will be posted advising of closures and restrictions.
- Access to adjacent properties will always be maintained or will be accommodated.
- Transit services will be maintained.
- After each work shift, each area will be securely covered and marked for safety until workers return or the work is complete.
- Work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- Crews will return to the work zones in the future to perform maintenance on devices.
