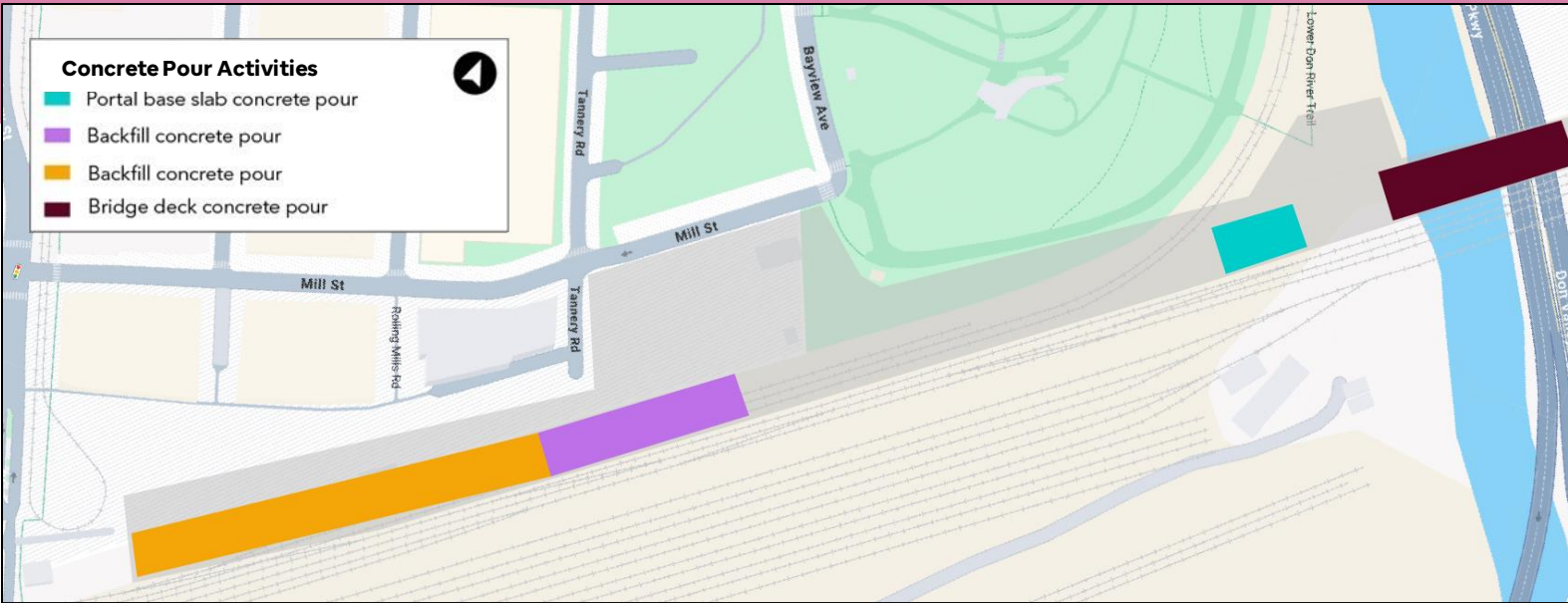


Update: Periodic Overnight Concrete Pours in the Don Yard

Expected completion: End of December 2026



What is happening?

- Concrete placement for the underground tunnel structure in the Don Yard is currently underway.
- **Construction hours are Monday to Saturday, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. However, periodic overnight concrete work will be required outside of typical hours through December 2026.**
- These activities are carefully planned to ensure proper concrete curing, suitable weather conditions, and crew safety because:
 - Continuous placement requires coordinating a high volume of trucks within a specific timeframe.
 - Overnight scheduling reduces conflicts with daytime traffic, pedestrians, and cyclists.
 - During summer months, rising daytime temperatures make this type of work unsafe for crews. Cooler overnight conditions are essential for safe operations.

What to expect

Activity related to overnight concrete pours will include:

- Crews on site outside regular working hours
- Construction vehicles and equipment and crews to be on onsite overnight.
- Noise from construction equipment, including concrete trucks, pumps, cranes, loaders, and other machinery can be expected.
- During concrete pours, there will be an increase in construction vehicles accessing the site.
- Trucks will enter and exit the site via Mill Street and will only use main roads to travel to and from the site.
- Site lighting will be positioned downward and away from residences.
- Noise, vibration, and air quality monitoring are in place to minimize disruption and help ensure regulatory levels are maintained.
- Construction equipment and materials will be properly secured within the work zone.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to inclement weather and/or unforeseen circumstances.
- Please exercise caution around active construction sites.

About the Ontario Line
