

Substructure and support column construction works to begin within work areas at Leslieville Station.

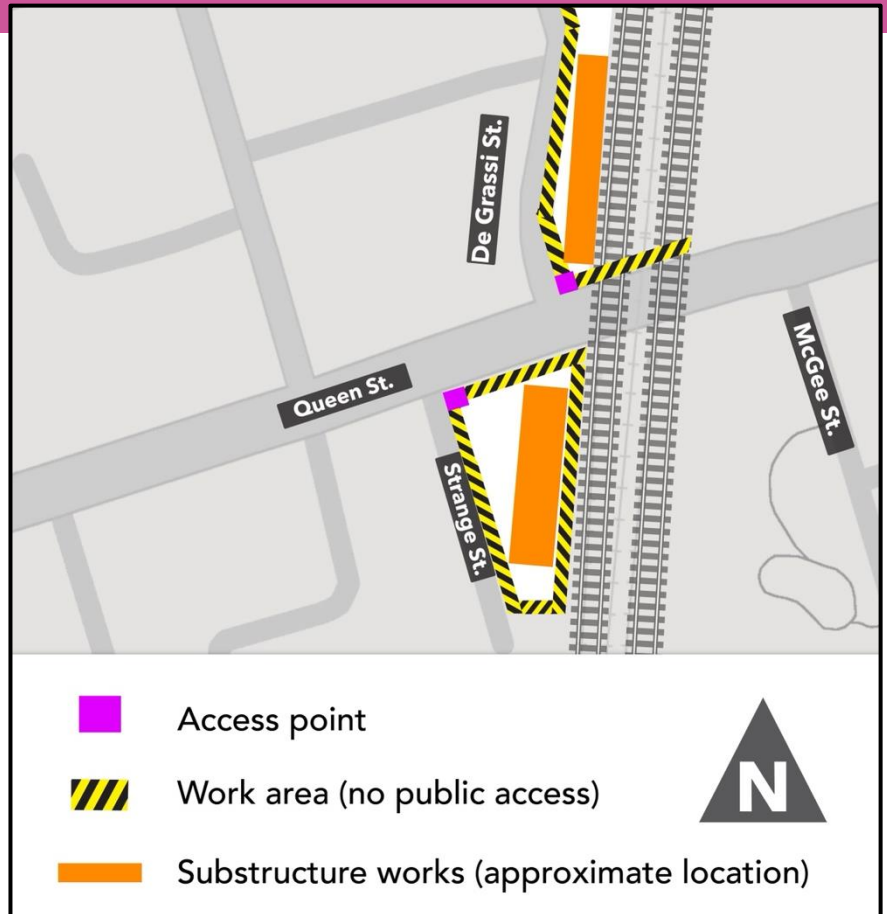

What is happening?

To build the future Leslieville Station, support column construction is required. This work will include installing steel reinforcing bar, erecting formwork, pouring concrete, and allowing the concrete to cure. All works will take place within the site and are not expected to impact nearby roads or sidewalks. Work will take place between **September 7, 2026 to May 28, 2027**. Crews will begin work on the eight columns in the south work area at Queen St. East and Strange Street, then continue construction of another eight columns in the north work area at Queen St. East and De Grassi Street. Construction will **primarily occur from Monday to Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.** Concrete work may need to continue without interruption to ensure the structural integrity of the columns. As a result, **occasionally there may be nighttime work during the week until 11 p.m. and weekend work from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.** to complete these activities.



What to expect

- Construction trucks bringing in materials will be entering and exiting the worksite.
- All construction will take place within the worksite.

Traffic Changes

- Minor delays may be experienced near the work zone.
- A paid duty officer or flaggers, and detour signs will be onsite to direct traffic as needed.
- All businesses in the area will remain open during the work. Please follow signage for access.

Pedestrian Access

- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

Transit Service

- There is no anticipated impact to transit services.

About the Ontario Line
