

Piling works on west side of Millwood Road at Overlea Boulevard

Expected start date: As early as September 14, 2026

Expected duration: Until October 2, 2026

Hours of work: Monday to Friday, 6 am to 7 pm

What is happening?

- As early as September 14, 2026, crews will begin drilling piles on the west side of Millwood Road at Overlea Boulevard as the foundation for a pier for the Ontario Line elevated guideway.
- Piling is the process of drilling large circular holes in the ground using a drill rig.
- These holes are then filled with rebar and concrete to form the foundations that will support the elevated guideway.
- Equipment used will include a pile rig, crane, excavators and other construction equipment as necessary.

What to expect

- Noise and vibrations from the movement of construction equipment can be expected.
- Work crews will take reasonable precautions to minimize disturbances to neighbours and residents.
- Short-term traffic interruptions will occur as equipment crosses the road.
- Signage and safety barriers will be in place to separate work zones.
- Construction work may be postponed or rescheduled due to unforeseen weather conditions or other construction-related impacts.

Traffic and Pedestrian details

- Flaggers will be onsite to direct vehicle and pedestrian traffic during equipment movements.
- The southbound bicycle lane on Millwood will remain closed.
- Bus stops will remain accessible throughout the work.

About the Ontario Line

- 15.6-kilometre subway line that will make it faster and easier to travel within Toronto and beyond.
- 15 stops and more than 40 connections to other transit, including GO train, subway, LRT, street-car, and bus lines.
- Less than 30 minutes from one end of the line to the other.
- 28,000 fewer cars on the road each day.
