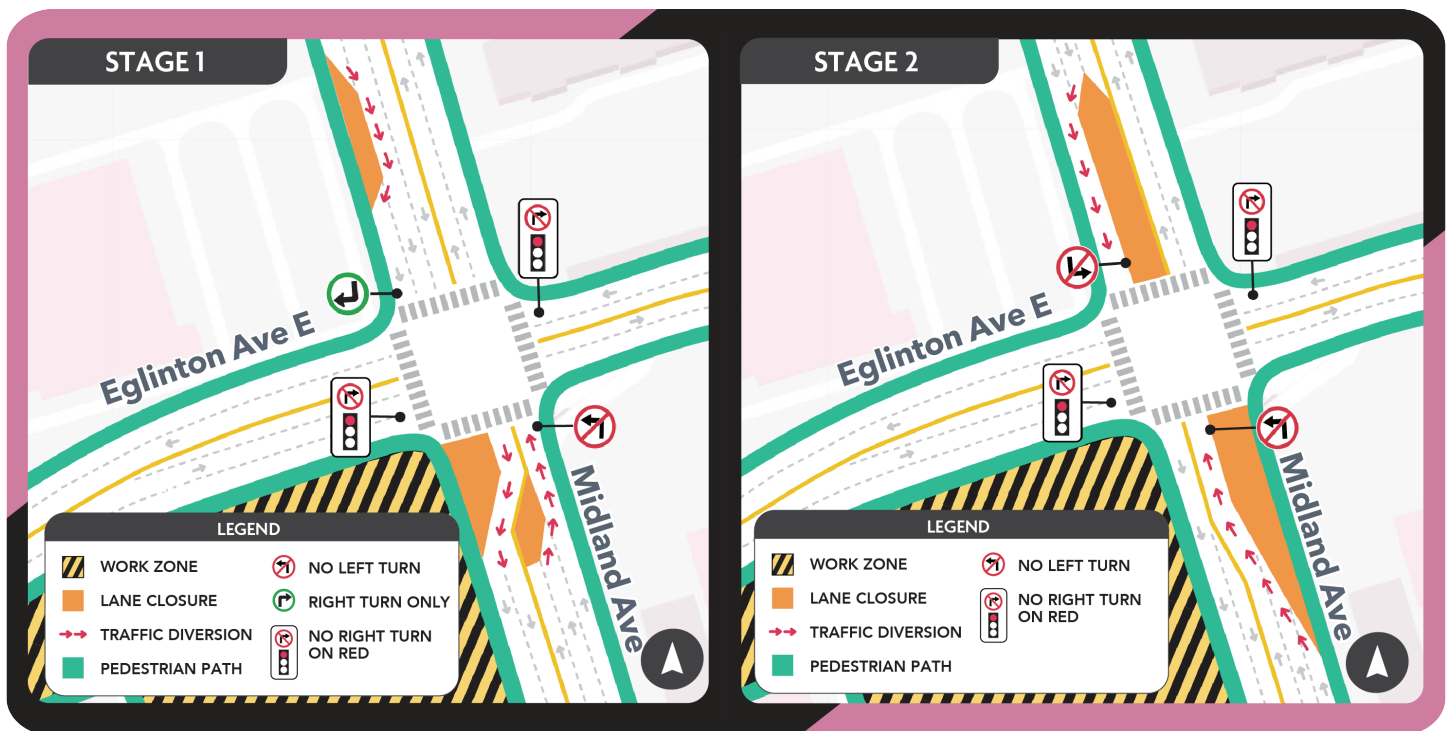


Night work and lane diversions at Midland Avenue and Eglinton Avenue East intersection

Schedule: September 13 – 25, 2026

Hours of Work: 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.



What is Happening

- As part of Scarborough Subway Extension construction, lane reductions and diversions are needed to relocate utilities near Midland Avenue and Eglinton Avenue East.
- To minimize traffic disruptions, work will be completed between 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. with the roadway returning to normal each morning.
- This work will be completed in two stages, one diverting lanes to the east, and one diverting lanes to the west.

What to Expect

Light

- Where possible, lights from equipment will be positioned away from residential homes to keep light pollution levels low.

Dust

- Trucks and equipment may generate dust during construction.

Utilities

- No utility disruptions are anticipated.

General

- Increased presence of construction vehicles and equipment can be expected in the work area.
- Work areas will be clearly marked or fenced off to ensure public safety.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Traffic

- Minor delays may be experienced near the work zone.
- North and southbound lanes on Midland Avenue will be reduced for periods of time during the work. Signage will redirect traffic around the work zones.
- Two-way directional traffic will be maintained during the work.
- A paid duty officer, flaggers and detour signs will be onsite as needed to direct traffic.

Transit Services

- There is no anticipated impact to transit services.

Noise and Vibration

- Residences and businesses in the area may experience noise and vibration caused by construction equipment related to this work.

Pedestrian Access

- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

About the Project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options, including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, Line 5 Eglinton, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
