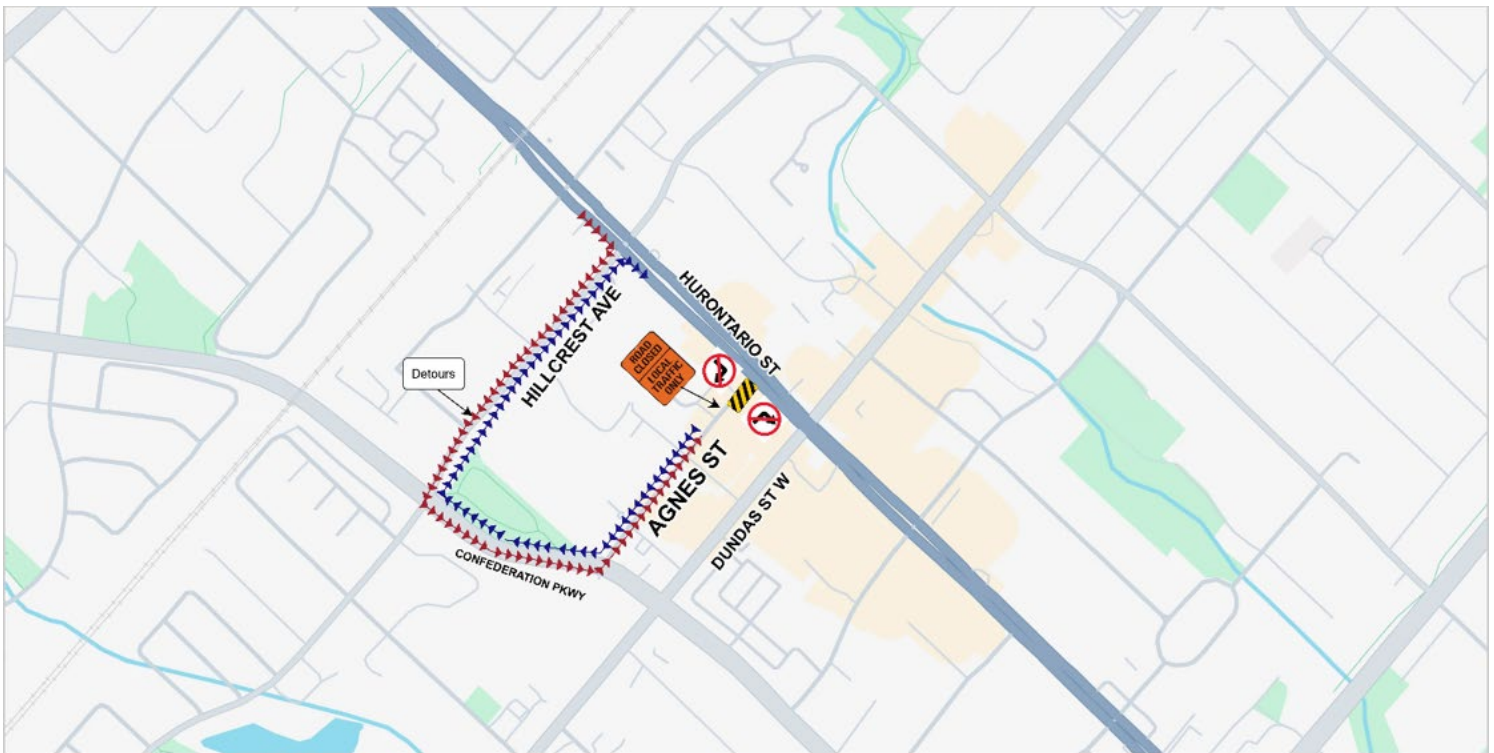


Road Closure of Agnes Street at Hurontario Street

Scheduled Start Date: September 8, 2026

Scheduled End Date: September 14, 2026

Working Hours: Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

What Is Happening?

Crews will be installing Alectra hydro poles at the intersection of Agnes Street and Hurontario Street:

- Traffic impacts will be in place between September 8 and 14, 2026.
- September 8 to 11, 2026: Eastbound traffic on Agnes Street will be restricted from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- September 14, 2026: Agnes Street will be fully closed at Hurontario Street.

What to Expect?

- Construction lighting may be visible from the work site.
- Crews will take precautions to monitor and reduce dust.
- Increased presence of construction vehicles and equipment can be expected in the work area.
- Work areas will be clearly marked or fenced off to ensure public safety.
- Please exercise caution around active construction sites.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Traffic Changes

- Minor delays may be experienced near the work zone.
- A paid duty officer, flaggers and detour signs will be onsite to direct traffic as needed.
- All businesses in the area will remain open during the work. Please follow signage for access.

Pedestrian Access

- Temporary sidewalk closures or pedestrian detours will be in place while the work is underway, with signs in place to direct pedestrians as needed.

Noise & Vibration

- Crews will take measures to minimize disruptions to the surrounding area wherever possible.
- Residences and businesses in the area can expect noise and vibration caused by construction equipment related to this work.

Transit Service

- There is no anticipated impact to transit services.

About the Project

- Once in service, the 18-kilometre Hazel McCallion Line will bring a new, environmentally friendly and reliable method of transportation to a rapidly growing region. The new transit system will feature 19 stops, travel through two urban growth centres and connect to major transit systems including GO Transit (Milton and Lakeshore West lines), the Mississauga Transitway, Brampton Transit, ZUM and MiWay. The Hazel McCallion Line will operate in its own dedicated lane ensuring a smooth, reliable and convenient ride along the region's busiest street.
