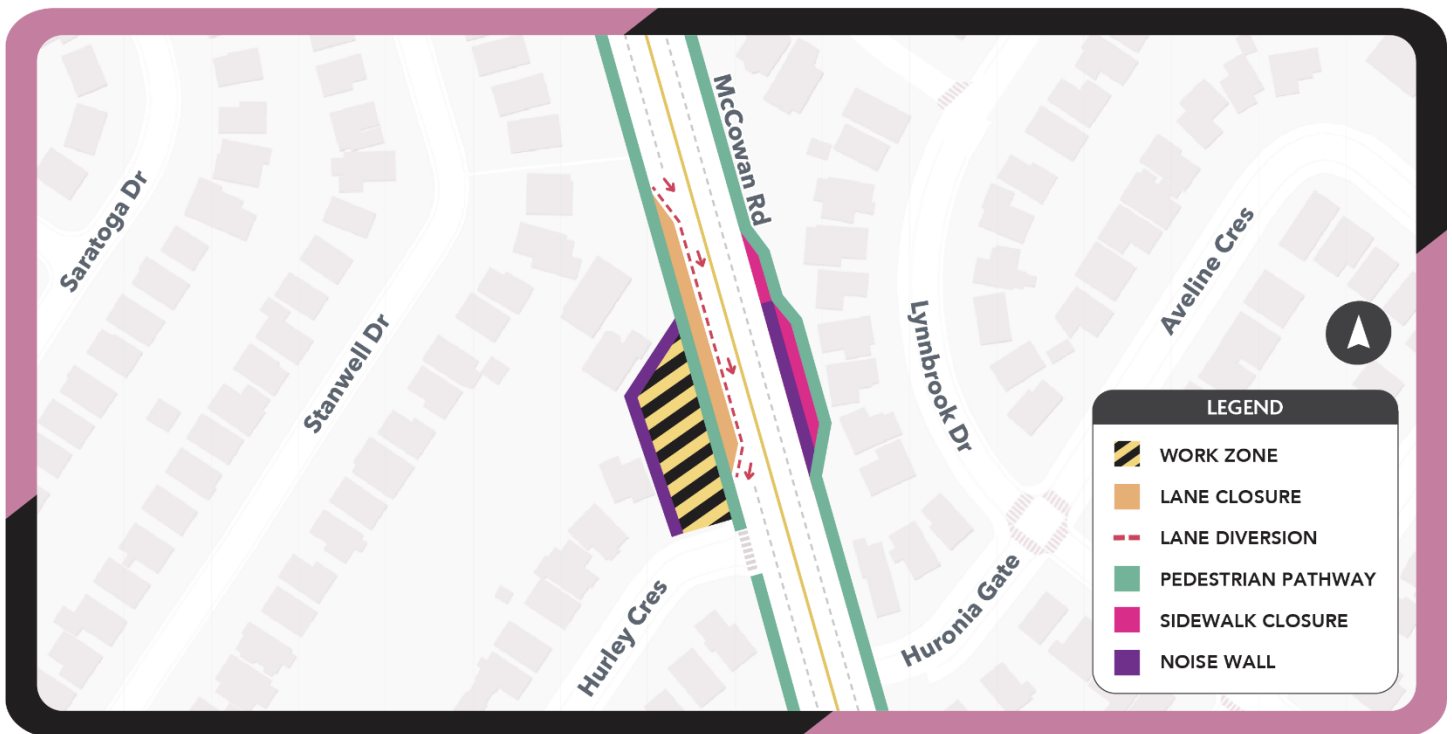


Temporary lane closure for utility work on McCowan Avenue north of Hurley Crescent

Schedule: Sep. 11 - 18, 2026

Hours of Work: 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., weekdays



What is Happening

- From September 11 to 18, a temporary five-metre-high noise barrier wall will be installed around the Scarborough Subway Extension work zone located at 1072 McCowan Road. Noise barrier walls significantly reduce noise and provide a more peaceful and quieter living environment to nearby businesses and residences. This work will not block any road or residential property access.
- Crews will be relocating utilities on McCowan Avenue at Hurley Crescent between September 14 and 16.

- This work will require temporary closure of the southbound curb lane just north of the Hurley Crescent during the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Lanes will be reopened at the end of each shift.

What to Expect

General

- Work areas will be clearly marked or fenced off to ensure public safety.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Utility Impacts

- No utility impacts are expected as a result of this work

Traffic

- Minor delays may be experienced near the work zone.
- The southbound curb lane on McCowan Avenue will be closed for periods of time during the work. Signage will redirect traffic around the work zones.
- Two-way directional traffic will be maintained during the work.
- A paid duty officer, flaggers and detour signs will be onsite as needed to direct traffic.

Noise and Vibration

- Residences and businesses in the area may experience noise and vibration caused by construction equipment related to this work.

Pedestrian Access

- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

About the Project

- A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough.
- Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options, including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, Line 5 Eglinton, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension.
- The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
