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Metrolinx, in collaboration with the City of Mississauga, is continuing to advance planning for the Dundas BRT corridor by commencing the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP) for the Dundas BRT Mississauga East (between Etobicoke Creek and Confederation Parkway) Project, in accordance with Ontario Regulation 231/08. The purpose of the Dundas BRT Project is to evaluate the proposed transit corridor along a 48 km stretch of Dundas Street from Highway 6 in the City of Hamilton through to the Kipling Transit Hub in the City of Toronto, linking Etobicoke and Mississauga City Centres. More than 20 km of this 48 km municipal transit project would operate in bus lanes or in a dedicated right-of-way, separate from other traffic, allowing faster and more reliable transit connections.

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Engagement on Toronto, Mississauga West and Halton and Hamilton will continue through 2022.

The report does however state what groundwater management and mitigation plans will be required. The report also includes Table 9-1 Summary of Environmental Concerns, Mitigation Measures and Commitments during Construction. This table lists the various environmental components, potential impacts and how they will be addressed during construction. Included in the list are how excessed soil and construction dewatering will be addressed. RECOMMENDATIONS I have no comment for AECOM (2021a). I have no comment to make on AECOM (2021b) except to provide recommendations on future work. In completing site specific investigations for design and construction purposes, the proponent should collect site specific data to determine: a)Dewatering requirements and whether construction dewatering will be required. Depending upon the amounts required an EASR or permit To take Water may be required. Should an EASR or PTTW be required, the assessment should be completed as per MECP (2012-21; Technical guidance document for hydrogeological studies in support of category 3 applications and/or Technical guidance document for surface water studies in support of category 3 applications. Regional staff have reviewed the materials circulated on January 13th following the January 6th TAC Meeting #3 and we offer the following comments:


Active Transportation

- Please be advised, the Region of Peel recently issued a Notice of Study Completion for an Environmental Assessment along Cawthra (See link below). Metrolinx's proposed improvements to the Dundas and Cawthra intersection will need to be coordinated with the Region's planned improvements: https://www.peelregion.ca/pw/transportation/construction/environmental-assessment/cawthra-road.asp
- Dixie crosses Dundas at-grade, Regional staff request that the Metrolinx provide turning templates to review rationale for proposed intersection geometrics;
 - it appears an outdated aerial image is being used, as Dixie has an existing multi-use path (MUP) on the west side
 - o to improve cyclist connectivity, Metrolinx is encouraged to consider the provision of a north-south crossride at this location
- With respect to Slide 31, the cross section seems to be missing splash pads for snow storage along the entire corridor. Regional staff also request further information on the broader winter maintenance strategy along the Dundas corridor.

Traffic Operations

Dixie Road and Dundas Street intersection:


- Northbound/southbound left turns to be reviewed using Autoturn to make sure all design vehicles are not impacted by the median concrete bullnose protective barriers on Dundas St.
- Having a raised concrete bullnose barrier at the bullnose is not recommended unless it is a flexible barrier.
- Left turn movements on Dundas Street should be reviewed at some point if the future to determine if a fully protected left turn phase is required. With bus exclusive lanes in the centre of the road the alignment of the left turn lanes are not typical and the view of on-coming traffic may be obstructed.





Traffic Safety

• The crosswalks at the intersection of Dixie Road and Dundas Street are intersecting. Each crosswalk at the intersection should terminate at the curb.





Traffic Signals and Systems

Pedestrian crosswalk distance to be reduced by pushing crosswalks further
upstream on each leg. Current sketch shows NW & NE crosswalks are merging near
RT lanes (red circles, Image-1) and it is not a preferred scenario. This could be
attended in detailed design stage but Metrolinx to check now to see if they have
sufficient area to push the stations upstream on Dundas St, if required.



• Signal poles are usually placed 3.0m behind median bullnose which means it shall be placed on the BRT station green zone area, adjoining to the E & W crosswalks (blue circles, Image-1). This is to prevent poles being hit by vehicles if there is no median bullnose barrier. In such case, BRT station infrastructure must be shifted upstream to accommodate the poles.







The purpose of the Dundas BRT Project is to evaluate a proposed transit corridor along a 48 kilometre (km) stretch of Dundas Street from Highway 6 in the City of Hamilton (Waterdown) through to the Kipling Transit Hub in the City of Toronto, linking Etobicoke and Mississauga City Centres. More than 20 km of this 48 km municipal transit project would operate in bus lanes or in a dedicated right-of-way, separate from other traffic, allowing faster and more reliable transit connections. Planning is being undertaken by Metrolinx in collaboration with the municipalities in support of potential future municipal project implementation.

To get there, a TPAP – to study impacts and proposed mitigation strategies – will be completed for the Mississauga (East and West) and Toronto segments of the corridor, in accordance with Ontario Regulation 231/08.

A TPAP is a focused environmental impact assessment process created specifically for transit projects, regulated under Ontario's *Environmental Assessment Act*. It involves a preplanning phase followed by a regulated engagement and documentation period, which includes the issuance of a **Notice of Commencement (we are here)**, engagement with the public, stakeholders and Indigenous Nations, assessment of impacts, development of measures to mitigate negative impacts, and documentation. Following these phases, there is a 30-day public review period where the public has the opportunity to review the Environmental Project Report (EPR) and provide additional comments, followed by a 35-day Minister's review period.

A TPAP makes sure that the natural, social, cultural, and economic environments are assessed and potential adverse effects from the proposed Project are avoided, mitigated, or minimized where feasible. TPAPs are regulated under Ontario's *Environmental Assessment Act*, and are submitted for the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks' review prior to proceeding with the transit project.

The TPAP for Dundas BRT Mississauga East Project will commence on **December 10**, **2021**. The attached Notice of Commencement will be used as the announcement and will be posted on the Project webpage, published in Mississauga-based newspapers, distributed via email to Project stakeholders and distributed via mail to residents and property owners within and surrounding the Mississauga East study area.

Upcoming Public Engagement

Following the Notice of Commencement, the third round of public engagement, which will present the results of the environmental studies and Preliminary Design refinements made to the Mississauga East (between Etobicoke Creek and Confederation Parkway) segment of the corridor, will be available online from **January 18 to February 1, 2022**, at MetrolinxEngage.com/DundasBRT.



Executive Summary

- The City of Mississauga and Metrolinx working in collaboration, have initiated the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP) under Ontario Regulation 231/08 for the Dundas BRT Mississauga East segment (Confederation Parkway to Etobicoke Creek) with the issuance of the Notice of Commencement on December 10, 2021.
- In the subsequent regulated period, proponent consultation on the preferred project and the development of the Environmental Project Report have been undertaken.
- The Notice of Completion will be published on February 22, 2022 and the Environmental Project Report will be made available for a final public review, prior to a Ministerial Review

 The Dundas BRT Mississauga East segment (Confederation Parkway to Etobicoke Creek) supports the City of Mississauga's funding application to the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP).

Background

In 2018, City of Mississauga completed the Dundas Connects Master Plan, which established a transportation and planning vision for Dundas Street through a comprehensive consultation process and that was undertaken to meet the requirements of Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Planning Process.

The City of Mississauga subsequently approved the report titled "Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program - Public Transit and Community, Culture and Recreation Funding Applications" to Budget Committee on October 2, 2019 from the Commissioner of Corporate Services and Chief Financial Officer, to support an application for implementation funding to the Public Transit Stream of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) focussed on developing bus priority infrastructure for a 7 km segment of the Dundas Street Corridor from Confederation Parkway to the Etobicoke boundary.

The City of Mississauga, as set out in the report "Request for Authority to Enter into Cost Sharing Agreement with Metrolinx to undertake the Dundas Bus Rapid Transit Corridor Preliminary Design and Transit Project Assessment Process" to Council on July 8, 2020 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works, is collaborating with Metrolinx in the review of a 48km stretch of Dundas Street from Highway 6 in the City of Hamilton to the Kipling Transit Hub in the City of Toronto, including through the City of Mississauga. The Dundas Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) review will be looking at the whole corridor but will focus on completing outstanding Environmental Assessment reviews through three separate segments that cover Toronto, Mississauga East and Mississauga West.

Comments

The City of Mississauga working in conjunction with Metrolinx, formally initiated the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP), a streamlined Environmental Assessment process under Ontario Regulation 231/08 on December 10, 2021 with the issuance of a Notice of Commencement to assess the Mississauga East segment of Dundas Street between Confederation Parkway and the Etobicoke Creek.

TPAP is a focused environmental impact assessment process created specifically for transit projects. It involves a pre-planning phase followed by a regulated engagement and documentation period once the Notice of Commencement has been issued, which includes engagement with the public, stakeholders and Indigenous groups, assessment of impacts, development of measures to mitigate negative impacts, and documentation. Following these phases, there is a 30-day public review period where the public has the opportunity to review the Environmental Project Report (EPR) and provide additional comments, followed by a 35-day Minister's review period.

A TPAP makes sure that the natural, social, cultural, and economic environments are assessed and potential adverse effects from the proposed project are avoided, mitigated, or minimized where feasible. TPAPs are regulated under the Environmental Assessment Act, and are submitted for the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks' review prior to being able to proceed with the implementation of a transit project.

The Dundas Connects Master Plan (2018) established the underlying transportation and planning vision for Dundas Street. For this current phase of work, pre-planning and initial consultation was undertaken through online virtual public engagement sessions held in 2021 along with separate Technical Advisory Group and Stakeholder Advisory Group meetings and circulation to Indigenous groups. The first engagement round of the Pre-Planning phase was held between April 19th to April 30th, to provide a project overview and gather input on the process and evaluation criteria. A second engagement round was also held between September 2nd to September 23rd, with a live online session on September 22nd. The second engagement round reported on the existing environmental conditions and provided an initial assessment for design considerations, specifically within the physically constrained areas of Cooksville and Erindale Valley.

While the Mississauga West and Toronto segments of the Dundas BRT Study are still being developed with further public engagement proposed near the end of 2022, TPAP has been initiated for the Dundas BRT Mississauga East with the issuance of the Notice of Commencement on December 10 2021. The Dundas BRT Mississauga East was specifically expedited as part of the initial work plan to support the City's funding application to the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP). The ICIP funding, once approved, comes with a commitment to have work completed by 2027 and subsidies cannot be used for purpose of land acquisition.

The TPAP approval is an important milestone for achieving the ICIP schedule as it: identifies environmental commitments for implementation that must be incorporated into the procurement documents, which are commencing development in Summer 2022; enables design for utility work to commence in Spring 2022 and commencement of selected high risk utility work to be advanced; and is required to support any required property acquisition to commence in Spring 2022 in order for it to be completed by Spring 2024 in time for potential construction to commence.

The regulated proponent consultation phase required for the Dundas BRT Mississauga East TPAP occurred through an online virtual public engagement held between January 18th to February 1st, with a live online session held on January 27th. Available materials included: a description of the Bus Rapid Transit project along with a preliminary design for the corridor; a summary of the environmental impacts of the project have been assessed and evaluated along with proposed measures identified to mitigate impacts, where feasible.

A preliminary design of the corridor has been developed to a level of detail in order to assess the environmental impacts. The preferred design solution included a context sensitive approach utilizing the Official Plan road right-of-way. The typical roadway cross section shown on Figure 1 includes two traffic lanes in each direction, two dedicated median bus rapid transit lanes, intersection left turn lanes and far side transit stop platforms at selected locations, and an enhance boulevard space with directional cycle tracks. The preferred design is to be refined further through the subsequent completion of the preliminary design phase which will confirm the extent of the property requirements necessary for Dundas BRT implementation. Property requirements for the Dundas BRT will be subject to funding approval and will continue to be acquired in coordination with future development applications as identified in the Official Plan.

Figure 1 – Typical Cross Section

The range of comments received through the public engagement included support for opportunities to expand and improve cycling facilitates, providing faster and more reliable transit and providing connections to other key hubs and services. A sample of the concerns were raised included impacts to private properties, noise and vibration impacts, accommodating traffic flows and preserving existing buildings and community culture.

Implementation funding and related project phasing is not generally a factor of the environmental assessment review process. However, based upon the current level of design developed for the TPAP, the existing municipal funding allocated for land acquisition associated with the ICIP submission would not be sufficient to address the anticipated project implementation requirements at this time. In addition, Ward 7 Councillor Dipika Damerla has specifically raised concerns regarding the design vision for Dundas BRT through Cooksville and a desire to enhance walkability in the community. Through meetings with the Councillor, the City intends to defer any Dundas BRT capital infrastructure implementation within Cooksville (between Camilla Road and Confederation Parkway) until staff report back to Council on an updated design assessment. Any Dundas BRT capital or property funding approvals impacting

Cooksville would go through Council and the City will continue to acquire lands in coordination with future development applications as identified by the Official Plan.

During the regulated proponent consultation phase, the Dundas BRT Mississauga East Environmental Project Report (EPR) has been developed which details the summary provided through the public engagement with: a statement of purpose and description of the transit project, including the preliminary design for the corridor; the environmental impacts of the project have been assessed and evaluated along with commitments to measures identified to mitigate impacts, where feasible. The consultation process with public engagement activities and comments are documented in the EPR. The EPR also includes appendices on studies undertaken to support the project which are:

- Air Quality Impact Assessment Report
- Arborist Report
- Climate Change and Sustainability Report
- Cultural Heritage Report
- Limited Phase 1 Environmental Site Assessment Report
- Natural Environmental Report
- Socio-Economic and Land Use Report
- Stage 1 Archaeology Report
- Noise and Vibration Report

The executive summary of the draft EPR is attached as **Appendix 1**.

Subject to Council endorsement of the draft EPR and the preferred solution for the Dundas BRT Mississauga East, and in accordance with the timeline prescribed by Ontario Regulation 231/08, a Notice of Completion will be published in the local newspaper and mailed to area property owners and technical agencies on February 22, 2022. As per the TPAP requirements, the completed EPR with associated appendices will then be made available for a 30-day public review period in order to allow for additional public comments, followed by a 35-day Minister's review period. A final Statement of Completion will be issued when all stages of TPAP have been completed and the final project details will be summarized for the public when future Dundas BRT meetings are held later this year.

Financial Impact

The collaboration between the City of Mississauga and Metrolinx to undertake TPAP and the preliminary design for Dundas Street is fully funded through PN19-107 Dundas BRT TPAP.

Conclusion

The City of Mississauga and Metrolinx working in collaboration, have initiated the formal Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP) under Ontario Regulation 231/08 for the Dundas BRT Mississauga East segment (Confederation Parkway to Etobicoke Creek) with the issuance of the Notice of Commencement on December 10, 2021

The Dundas BRT Mississauga East (Confederation Parkway to Etobicoke Creek) supports the City of Mississauga's \$305 Million Capital funding application to the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program.

In the subsequent regulated consultation period of TPAP, public, agency, interested stakeholders and indigenous groups have been consulted on the preferred project and the development of the Environmental Project Report (EPR) has been undertaken.

Subject to Council endorsement of the draft EPR and the preferred solution for the Dundas BRT Mississauga East, and in accordance with the timeline prescribed by Ontario Regulation 231/08, a Notice of Completion will be published on February 22, 2022. As per the TPAP requirements, the completed EPR with associated appendices will then be made available for a 30-day public review period in order to allow for additional public comments, followed by a 35-day Minister's review period. A final Statement of Completion will be issued when all stages of TPAP have been completed and the final project details will be summarized for the public when future Dundas BRT meetings are held later this year.

As we show in Section 5.6, riverine flooding currently exists along Dundas Street with the current climate

A description of our Risk Assessment process can be found in Sections 5.1-5.5 (or Sections 6.1-6.5 of the EPR) and summarized below:

- We have identified climate indicators (Heavy Rainfall and Winter Rain on Snow) both with >= 25mm rain and have assigned them probabilities current and future, which does identify increasing frequency, although the probability does not change.
- We then determined the Risk (probability x consequences) from determination of consequences in four categories.
- For all risks that are given a moderate or high risk interaction result from the risk assessment, adaptation measures have been provided. These can be found in Table 5-11 (or Table 6-11 in the EPR).

Adding a new climate parameter to Table 5-11 (or Table 6-11) would require us to redo the risk assessment. Please note, redoing the risk assessment would not result in the recommendation of any additional climate change adaptation measures, as the climate indicators (Heavy Rainfall and Winter Rain on Snow) are already considered moderate or high risk (and thus adaptation measures are already provided for these parameters). Because of this, we believe that redoing the risk assessment and adding a new climate parameter is not warranted.

We have reviewed the responses provided and generally find them acceptable at this stage of the process. We have one follow up comment/note for your consideration regarding your response to comment #4:

We have some concerns with the response to this comment in relation to climate change. You suggest adding text that will recognize current constraints and adopt risk assessment Table 6.11. This table recognizes "high risk" of flooding during rainfall greater than 25mm but does not recognize increasing frequency of these storm under climate change. We recommend that you should consider recognizing that climate change will increase the frequency of rain storms and use it in the risk assessment (Table 6.11). We recognize that "urban flooding" is beyond CVC's mandate but from a hazard perspective, climate change will not impact Regulatory Storm (Regional Storm for Cooksville Creek), however, the frequency of the 100-year storm will increase. We suggest table Table 6.11 should have a flooding risk due to climate change – considering July 8, 2013 flooding in Cooksville Creek and similar other storm in the GTA.

Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) staff received the response to TRCA comments dated November 15, 2021 on January 19, 2022. Staff understand that the final EPR study will be circulated when complete. Staff have completed their review and provide comments in Appendix A.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Staff understands that the draft Environmental Project Report (EPR) has been prepared to support the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP) for the Dundas Bus Rapid Transit Mississauga East Project (Project). The Project includes the planning and design of a 7-kilometer bus rapid transit corridor from Confederation Parkway to the City of Toronto boundary at Etobicoke Creek, in the City of Mississauga. TRCA's jurisdiction starts from approximately Queen Frederica Drive to the eastern study limits. The study also confirms two crossing structures within TRCA's jurisdiction (Etobicoke Creek Bridge and Little Etobicoke Creek Culvert), and staff understand that both structures are proposed to be replaced.

PROJECT REVIEW

The City of Mississauga's Dundas Connects Master Plan (Master Plan) is being implemented through multiple studies including this TPAP. TRCA provided comments to the City of Mississauga (City) during the Master Plan process in our role as representing the Provincial interest in natural hazards as per section 3.1 of the Provincial Policy Statement. Staff look forward to working with Metrolinx and the City through the Special Policy Area and flood mitigation projects in a collaborative approach to design, phasing, approval and implementation of proposed infrastructure in this study area.

Enforcement of High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) compliance is a local police task. Concerns regarding current HOV compliance can also be directed to the City of Mississauga by email via public.info@mississauga.ca.

A compliance and violation audit for the existing HOV lanes is not proposed for this study.

We note that prior HOV modelling completed as part of the Dundas Connects Master Plan incorporated HOV lane usage counts and carried lane distribution proportions forward to future years in the forecasting assessment. However, the proposed condition with median BRT lanes for the Mississauga East segment would have much greater compliance since they are often physically separated from general traffic, and in the middle of the street. Therefore, BRT dedicated lanes would not be subject to current HOV non-compliant movements from general traffic turning at entrances and side streets, which is currently experienced in the existing HOV lanes.

Please install traffic counting devices in the HOV lanes from Cawthra to Etobicoke, at various points, to validate the claim as only being used for HOV use.

Thank you for your participation in the Mississauga Stakeholder Advisory Group and your interest in the Dundas Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project. Your comments have been received and will be recorded.

The Dundas BRT lanes will be implemented through a mix of converting existing road space and also by road widening to accommodate the new BRT lanes. The Dundas BRT is part of Metrolinx's big picture for

an integrated, multi-modal regional transportation system that will serve the needs of our communities. In addition, it supports Ontario's Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe, which sets out a broad vision for where and how our region will grow and identifies policies on transportation planning in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area. The previous municipal planning studies, including the Dundas Connects Master Plant Study, and Metrolinx's Initial Business Case indicated the need for improved bus transit infrastructure along Dundas Street.

The BRT will introduce a more reliable and faster alternative to private vehicle travel which, along with the introduction of dedicated cycle tracks and wider sidewalks, is anticipated to encourage a shift in travel mode from private vehicle travel to more sustainable modes of travel such as public transit, cycling and walking.

As you have suggested, the section of the Mississauga East Segment between Etobicoke Creek and Cawthra Road currently consists of six lanes, and to introduce the dedicated median Dundas BRT lanes, a traffic lane in each direction will need to be used for the BRT guideway.

However, the two lanes east of Dixie Road to be used are currently operating as 3+ High-Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lanes during peak periods and as such those lanes do not currently serve traditional auto capacity and will not have a significant corresponding impact to general traffic lanes.

The section between Dixie Road and Cawthra Road currently consists of six lanes and similarly, to introduce the dedicated median BRT lanes, a traffic lane in each direction will need to be removed and allocated for the BRT guideway.

For the section between Cawthra Road and Confederation Parkway, the existing four general-purpose traffic lanes will be maintained with a widening to accommodate the new dedicated median BRT lanes.

The Project Team carried out some traffic modelling, specifically through the Cooksville area, which suggests that despite a change in travel habits and mode from private auto to Dundas BRT, the corridor would operate at capacity in our 2041 horizon year. Conversely, without transit improvements and a change in travel modes, the auto traffic delays would increase more than modelled.

Furthermore, several environmental studies have been completed, that have informed the Environmental Project Report (EPR), which suggest that the introduction of the Dundas BRT will have a positive impact on the communities that it will serve, not the least of which is laying the foundation for transit-oriented development. The EPR for Mississauga East will be available at MetrolinxEngage.com/DundasBRT in late-February 2022 as part of the 30-day public review period per the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP).

Finally, the Project Team will be undertaking more traffic and transit modelling to review traffic volumes, impacts to traffic, delays and congestion points in the areas and the projections up to 2041. This modelling will commence upon finalization of the forthcoming Transit Service and Routing Plan, which is expected in the spring/summer 2022. The traffic modelling results will be available for the public to review in round 4 of the Dundas BRT engagement.

We value the input from stakeholders such as yourself. It is vital that the public is fully engaged in the development of the Dundas BRT as residents' input-helps us mitigate, revise and strengthen the project's design. We encourage you and members from your resident's association to also review the public information centre currently live at MetrolinxEngage.com/DundasBRT. Your input will be documented and considered as the Dundas BRT project progresses.

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
