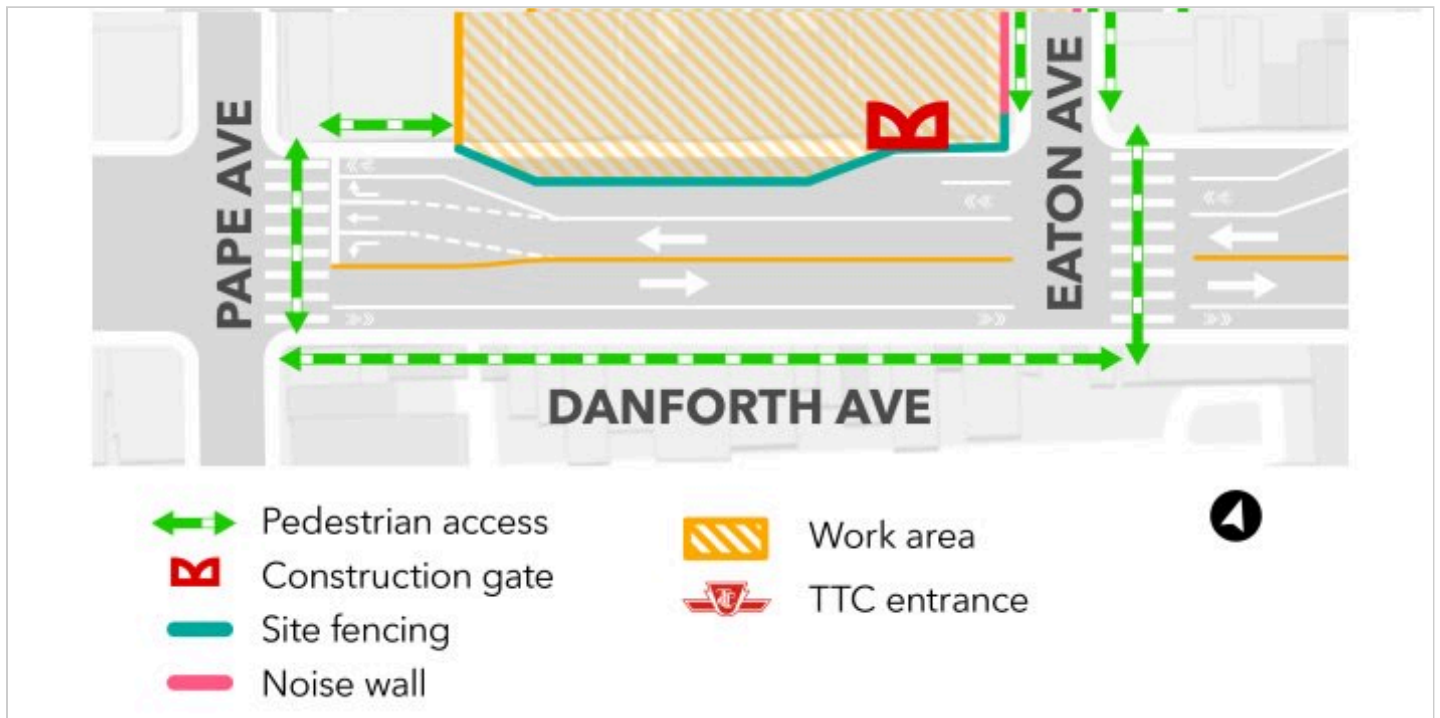


Traffic Lane Restoration on Danforth Avenue

Scheduled Start Date: May 11, 2026

Scheduled End Date: May 31, 2026

Working Hours: Monday to Friday, 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

What Is Happening?

Upon the completion of jet grouting work on Danforth Avenue, crews will restore the road and traffic lanes. The north sidewalk will remain closed. Weeknight shifts are only expected for a few nights at the end of May.

What to Expect?

- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances

Traffic Changes

- Minor delays may be experienced near the work zone.

Pedestrian Access

- Temporary sidewalk closures or pedestrian detours will be in place while the work is underway, with signs in place to direct pedestrians as needed.

Noise & Vibration

- Residences and businesses in the area may experience noise and vibration caused by construction equipment related to this work.
- Crews will take measures to minimize disruptions to the surrounding area wherever possible.

Transit Service

- There is no anticipated impact to transit services.
