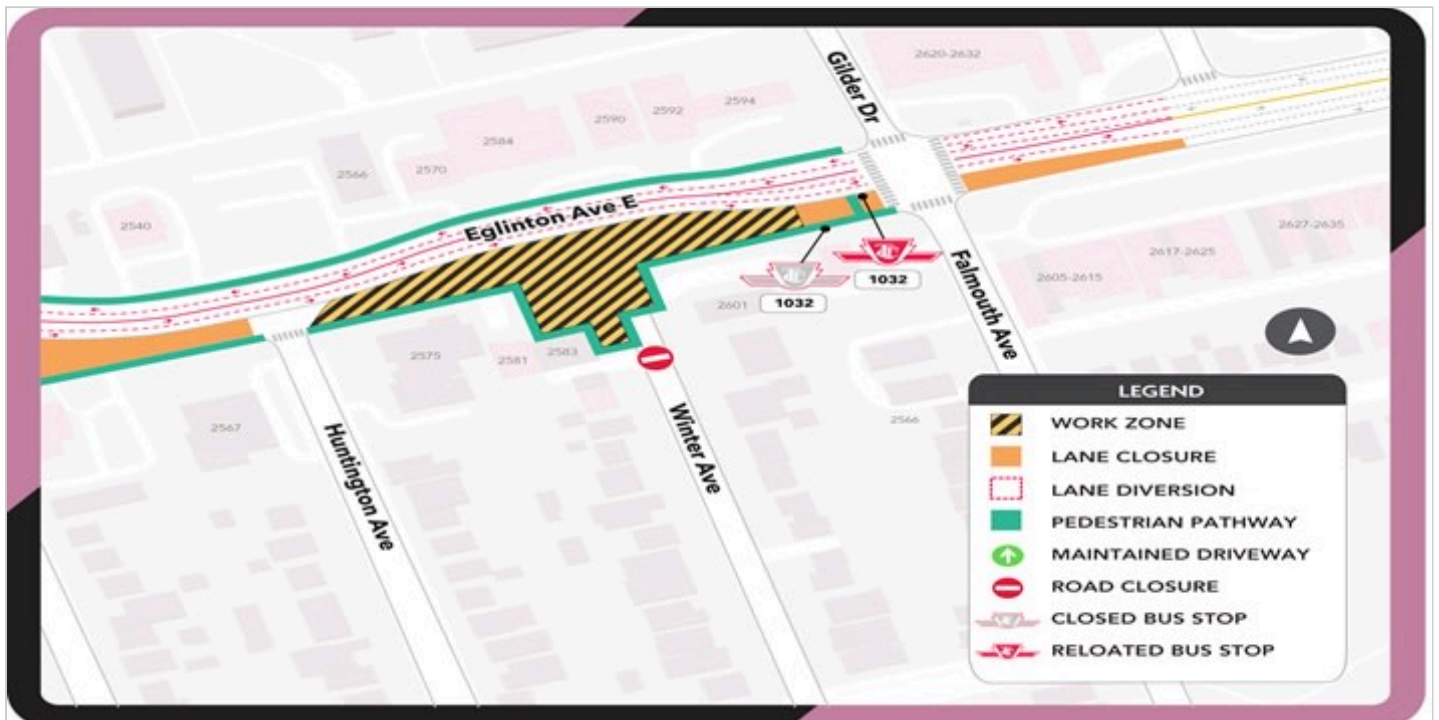


Overnight work on Eglinton avenue East near Winter Avenue

What Is Happening?

To prepare for future Scarborough Subway Extension construction, piling activities will be taking place within the work zone on Eglinton Avenue East near Winter Avenue. An additional lane closure will be implemented and remain in place from Friday at 7:00 p.m. to Monday at 7:00 a.m. This additional lane closure is needed as a safety requirement due to the location of the piling activity and will reduce the eastbound traffic to a single lane. Completing the work on the week-end minimizes traffic impacts.

Piling is the process of inserting concrete columns into the ground to reinforce the soil.

What to Expect?

- Where possible, lights from equipment will be positioned away from residential homes to keep light pollution levels low.
- Work areas will be clearly marked or fenced off to ensure public safety.
- Work may be delayed or rescheduled due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.

Traffic Changes

- Minor delays may be experienced near the work zone.
- Two-way directional traffic will be maintained during the work.
- A paid duty officer, flaggers and detour signs will be onsite to direct traffic as needed.

Pedestrian Access

- Clear and defined walking paths will be maintained during construction to ensure pedestrian safety.

Noise & Vibration

- Crews will take measures to minimize disruptions to the surrounding area wherever possible.
- Residences and businesses in the area can expect noise and vibration caused by construction equipment related to this work.

Transit Service

- There is no anticipated impact to transit services.
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About the Project

A nearly eight-kilometre subway extension will extend Line 2 further into Scarborough. Three new stops will have connections to up to six other transit options, including TTC buses, GO train, GO buses, Line 5 Eglinton, Durham Region Transit, and the proposed Sheppard Extension. The extension will accommodate up to 105,000 daily boardings and put 34,000 more jobs within walking distance to rapid transit.
